Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Church uses the month of November for the celebration of the saints of the Church at the beginning of the month, then delves into the understanding of our need to pray for the souls of the faithful departed. It is important to remember death and always draw close to God the Father in prayer, belief, and our actions. St. Thérèse de Lisieux offers a challenging but insightful understanding of this notion:

“I have always found that there is the same difference between the saints and me as there is between a mountain whose summit is lost in the clouds and a humble grain of sand trodden underfoot by passersby. Instead of being discouraged, I told myself: God would not make me wish for something impossible and so, in spite of my littleness, I can aim at being a saint. It is impossible for me to grow bigger, so I put up with myself as I am, with all my countless faults. But I will look for some means of going to heaven by a little way which is very short and very straight, a little way that is quite new...” (*Méditations, Journal*, 8.)

This month provides us with a great opportunity to understand the working of the Holy Spirit in our world so that we may walk the oath of holiness. Let us strive for the heavenly reward and draw all souls close to Christ the Lord as part of our Christian mission and privilege.
