Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. Devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ is an old tradition in different parts of the world but was universalized by St. Pope John Paul II, thanks to his familiarity with it since it started in his native Poland due to revelations by Christ to St. Faustina Kowalska.

In the Gospel for our feast day, we hear Christ pressing for the expansion of the Gospel and of the Christian way—at all times and under all circumstances. Earlier in the Gospel of Saint Luke, Christ simply disregarded the complaints of the apostles, James and John, regarding the conflict between the Samaritans and the Jews. For Christ, it was more important to press forward immediately for the salvation of souls. Nothing is more important to Christ than the salvation of souls.

In the Gospel, He makes this clear in His preaching and in His teaching. Unfortunately, we do not have the privilege of being in His physical presence as a man to ask questions or to witness His manifestations. Nevertheless, we possess the legacy of Divine Mercy. Our wonderful patroness, Saint Faustina, says: "Neither graces, nor revelations, nor ecstasies, nor any gifts granted to a soul make it perfect, but rather the intimate union of the soul with God. These gifts are mere adornments of the soul; they constitute neither its essence nor its perfection. My holiness and perfection consist in the close union of my will with the will of God." (*Diary, 7.*)

As we enjoy the Easter season, let us contemplate joy and mercy together as the seeds of our own holiness.
