Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the last two and a half weeks our nation has had to process the assassination of Charlie Kirk, the political activist and media personality. Unfortunately the different obligations of the parish schedule had delayed the opportunity to give the appropriate amount of attention to the tragic occasion. At the same time, the later half of this month has seen a fascinating unfolding of the legacy of this figure which is new to many of us; many are only now recognizing that the impact he had on the last decade of political life was deeper than previous perceptions.

More impressively, there is a very striking response to this troubling political violence: not only is there a growing consensus for cooler heads in civic discourse, there is a desire for a return to compassion and true dialogue. Lastly, there is an increased awareness of the importance of the Christian faith in the life of Charlie Kirk which informed his courage and concern for the return to informed discourse rather than shouting, polemics, and worse, obviously. Following this tragic assassination, there has been an impressive fascination with the infusion of Christian principles into the daily function of civics that has not been seen in the West since the Christian Democracy movement of the post-World War II era. The glimmer of hope that rises from this tragedy may very well be a growing intellectual conclusion that the daily working of our social system, by each of us, can and must naturally reflect the goodness of our Creator.

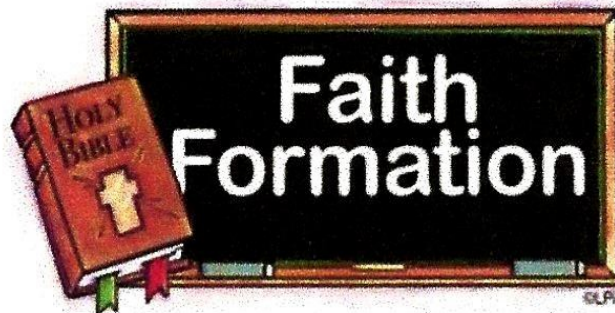
There is a great legacy that is being unpacked in the media and we would do well to learn as much from the evil of the tragedy as from the graceful speed of the recovery. The focus is turning swiftly toward actions of a social order committed to the peaceful dialogue that allows for understanding and authentic progress. The loss of this Christian man is shaping up to be the amplification of his spirit of understanding the outreach of God. Let us pray well for him, for our nation, and for each other as we learn and discern the will of God with a living faith.
