Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday, we are once again called to contemplate the nature of prayer by Christ. In St. Luke's rendition of the Pharisee and the tax collector, we see the essence of good prayer.

At the end of the week, we will celebrate two great feasts of the Church: the Feast of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls. Both of these important observations of the Church present us with a strong opportunity to exercise our ability to pray. November is the month traditionally appointed for focusing our prayer on the souls of those who have died. This tradition is both beautifully rooted in history but relevant to all of us in our time as we apply our personal and ecclesial prayers for the eternal rest of the faithful departed.

Interestingly enough, the Feast of All Saints precedes the month of prayer for the dead. On Friday, the activity of Halloween will remind us that the opportunity for focused prayer is approaching. While the costumes we are bound to see around town will not all be the costumes of saints as in ages past, the history of All Hallowed's Eve is a great reminder that we are joined in prayer with the saints in our spiritual undertaking of commending the deceased to God.


