Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past Thursday, the Church commemorated the feast of St. Joseph, a timely guide for our Lenten time. While the feast is not as popular as the commemoration of St. Patrick two days earlier, it holds a major place in certain cultures which celebrate the Guardian of the Messiah and is a great bolt of stability and thought in the Church's tradition.

From its earliest days to our time, St. Joseph has been an anchor of the faith for the Christian in the world. The late Pope Benedict XVI compounded five lessons which are useful for our Lenten mediation:

St. Joseph lived in righteousness

St. Joseph obeyed God without hesitation.

St. Joseph served as a strong earthly father and protected his family.

St. Joseph served as a provider for his family.

St. Joseph demonstrated the value of human labor as instituted by God.

The virtues of the patron of the Universal Church are ideas which we would do well to consider and ideals toward which we should strive in our own Christian existence. Let us always remember the example of faith, trust, and strength which the life of St. Joseph provides for us.

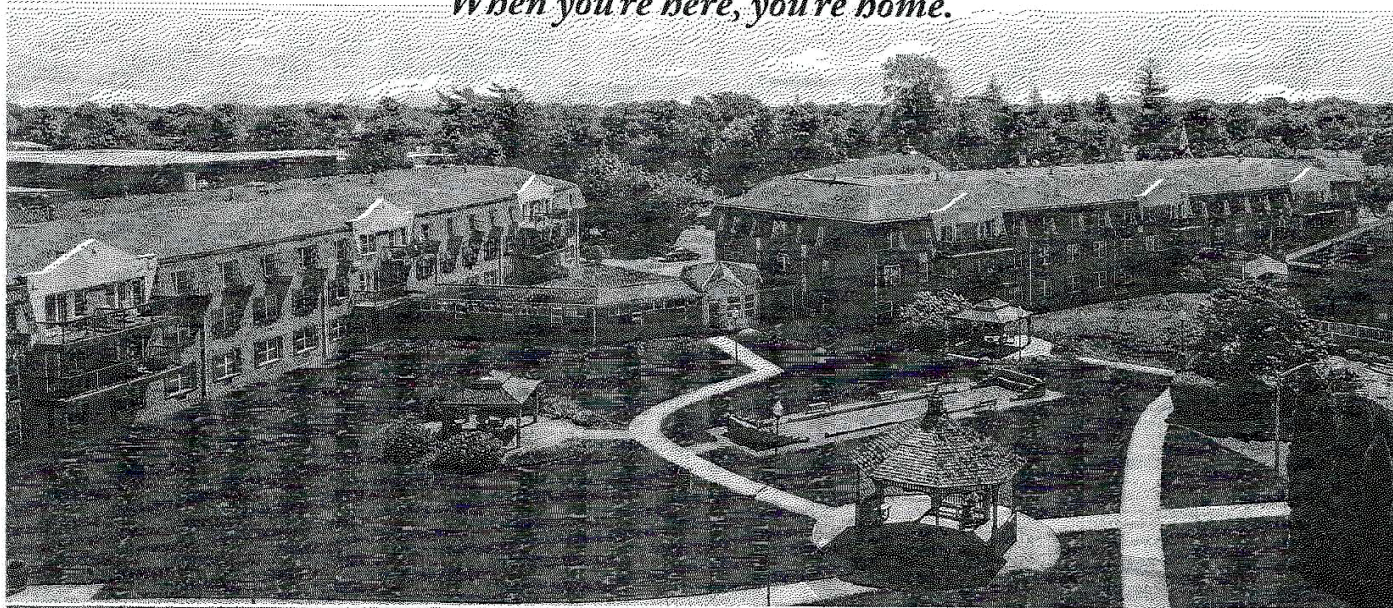

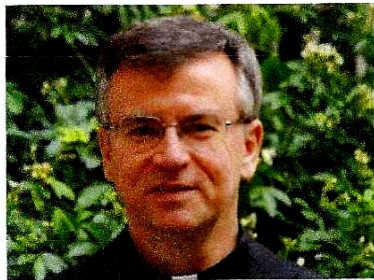
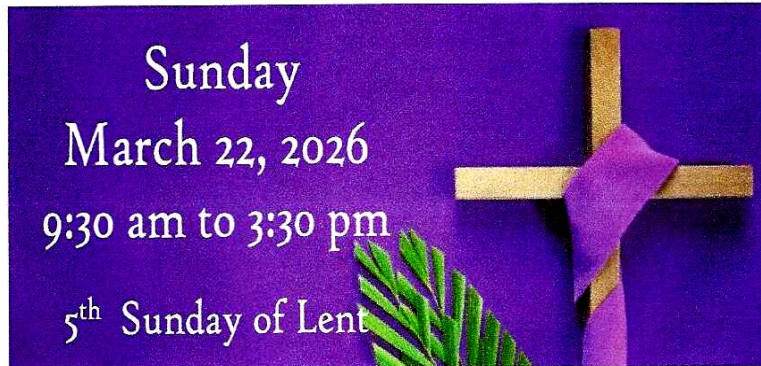
