Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday presents us with the great Christian anthem, as it were, of the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes represent the highs and lows of Christian experience. Above all, they point the way to the end of the Christian life, regardless of struggles or privileges, which is blessedness.

Blessedness, or beatitude, according to St. Thomas Aquinas’ authoritative phrasing, is to be with God. We hope that after a good Christian life, we will be with the Lord forever. In the meantime, we continue to experience various occasions which foreshadow or predict the beatitude of Heaven, if ever so briefly or vaguely. We must always be open to recognizing blessings from the Lord.

The Beatitudes teach us that the Lord is eager to bless us. St. Augustine once preached, “God is more anxious to bestow his blessings on us than we are to receive them.” Christ shows in the Beatitudes that not only can suffering lead to blessing, but also God’s blessings are bestowed in mundane ways; daily life is far more likely to be the occasion of blessing than a major epiphany or parting of the skies to hear God’s voice directly. We must attune our spiritual attention to the world around us in order to keep close to God. His companionship as we move forward will be a great benefit and indication of the reward of full life with him.

Of course, we do not simply reap from the world, we must not only be humble and interact, but we must also be good, upright Christians to others in word and deed. Here too, opportunities abound and our minds must be eager to discern them and our bodies eager to carry them out. Be they charitable acts or intensive prayers (we are not limited to one or the other,) that is how the Christian affects the world so that God may be known. Let us pray well.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Each year, the Church throughout the United States takes the opportunity to celebrate the gift of Catholic Education during Catholic Schools Week which, this year, began on January 29, 2023 and concludes on February 4, 2023. 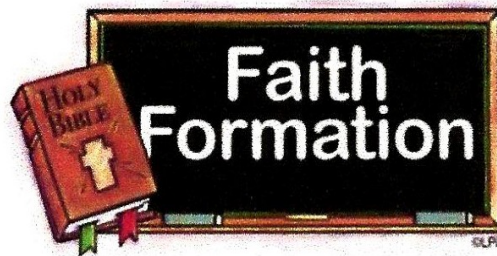
