Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter the midseason of Ordinary Time, Pope St. Leo the Great offers a fruitful encouragement as he was preaching in the Church’s early period of Lenten contemplation and devotion, Pope Leo the Great, offers a fruitful encouragement as he was preaching in the Church’s early period:

Therefore, dearly-beloved, seeing that, as we are taught by our Redeemer’s precept, “man lives not in bread alone, but in every word of God,” and it is right that Christian people, whatever the amount of their abstinence, should rather desire to satisfy themselves with the “Word of God” than with bodily food, let us with ready devotion and eager faith enter upon the celebration of the solemn fast, not with barren abstinence flora food, which is often imposed on us by weakness of body, or the disease of avarice, but in bountiful benevolence: that in truth we may be of those of whom the very Truth speaks, “blessed are they which hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled .” Let works of piety, therefore, be our delight, and let us be filled with those kinds of food which feed us for eternity. Let us rejoice in the replenishment of the poor, whom our bounty has satisfied. Let us delight in the clothing of those whose nakedness we have covered with needful raiment. Let our humaneness be felt by the sick in their illnesses, by the weakly in their infirmities, by the exiles in their hardships, by the orphans in their destitution, and by solitary widows in their sadness: in the helping of whom there is no one that cannot carry out some amount of benevolence. For no one’s income is small, whose heart is big: and the measure of one’s mercy and goodness does not depend on the size of one’s means. Wealth of goodwill is never rightly lacking, even in a slender purse. Doubtless the expenditure of the rich is greater, and that of the poor smaller, but there is no difference in the fruit of their works, where the purpose of the workers is the same. (*Sermon XLII, Lent, IV.*)

May our spiritual work this season bring us great fulfillment.

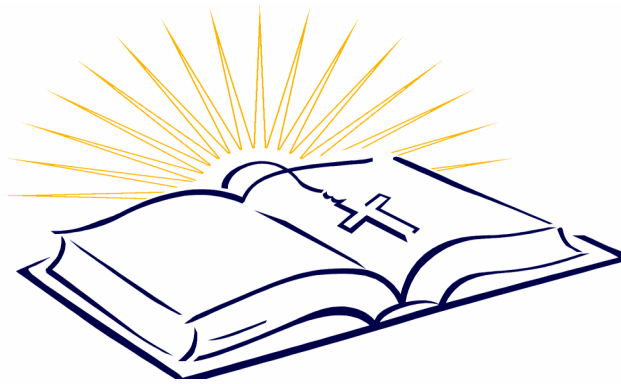

Lectors in the Diocese of Rockville Centre, New York must be prepared spiritually, scripturally and practically. They should also be able to convey the meaning of scripture to the the congregation. They should be registered in advanced and receive training from the diocese.

PREPARATION

Spiritual preparation: Pray over the text and reflect on its message.

Scriptural preparation: Understand the text and use the resource books provided by the parish.

Practical preparation: Practice delivering the text aloud, learn pronunciations, and master difficult words.

Immediate preparation: Arrive early, located readings, and check the sound system.

TRAINING

Register in advance with a letter from your Pastor.

Attend a Lector Workshop, which is available for new and experienced lectors.

In house training will be also be provided after Diocesan training.
