Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Once again, with great joy, the Church enters into the celebration of Christ's Resurrection in the celebration of Easter. The defeat of death by Christ the King is a celebration enshrined in ritual and tradition that distinguishes this part of the year from all others, from the other joyful and celebratory days to the more solemn observances.

The Resurrection of Christ shows us the impossibility of God being separated from us and our challenge is to enjoy the unity upon which God insists. One of the Church's greatest preachers of the High Middle Ages, Bishop Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet, explained, "To accomplish the work of unity, we should no longer see the world except in Christ. We ought to believe that every single ray of faith that is in us is a mere spark of the love that the eternal Father has for his Son, and because the Son our Savior is in us, the Father's love extends to us as well. It was unto this end that Jesus prayed." (*Méditations sur le Carême, Pâques.*)

The joy of Easter is that the Lord is insistent not only in existing (it is his nature) but also that he insists on being present with his people. In our parish, wherever we may find ourselves this Easter, and as the year makes its regular turn to warmth, productivity, and some relaxation, let us glory in the greatness of the God who loves us and tend to the spark of his love that is both our gift, treasure, and inspiration to reflect his goodness in the world.

Happy Easter to you and your families in this Jubilee Year of Hope!

Our celebration of Easter rekindles our hope each year.

The Tomb is empty! Jesus is Risen!

A wealthy man and a member of the Sanhedrin, St. Joseph of Arimathea is one of those Gospel characters with a very brief but very important role.


In John 19:38-42, we see that after Jesus' Crucifixion, Joseph of Arimathea asks Pilate for permission to take away Our Lord's Body. This was a bold and courageous act of faith from a man "seeking the Kingdom of God." (Mark 15:43)

Joseph and Nicodemus together place our Lord's Body reverently in linen cloths prepared with myrrh, aloes and spices: "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there."

In his commentary on the Gospel of Matthew, Fr. Simeon Leiva-Merikakis gives tribute to Joseph of Arimathea. He writes: "And how can we fail to do homage to Joseph of Arimathea? In performing a very humane corporal work of mercy by seeking out and burying the corpse of his beloved Teacher, Joseph becomes for all time a living icon of the eternal Father himself, stooping with compassion to enfold within his throbbing breast the mangled body of his beloved, Son, whom he himself handed over to sinners out of love for mankind. At long last, the Son of God on earth has fallen into the hands, not of a sinner, but of a just and compassionate man! Joseph of Arimathea enacts the justice and love of God himself."¹

As we celebrate Easter Sunday, the Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and the Easter Season, let us remember and ask the intercession of the great Joseph of Arimathea who prepared the Tomb of Christ and the Body of Christ with such sensitive care and compassion, such faith, courage and reverence. The Tomb is Empty! He is Risen!

Pascua 2025

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

¡Feliz Pascua para ustedes y sus familias en este Año Jubilar de la Esperanza! Nuestra celebración de la Pascua reaviva cada año nuestra esperanza.

¡La Tumba está vacía! ¡Jesús ha resucitado!

Un hombre adinerado y miembro del Sanedrín, San José de Arimatea es uno de esos personajes del Evangelio con un papel muy breve pero muy importante.

En Juan 19:38-42, vemos que después de la Crucifixión de Jesús, José de Arimatea pide permiso a Pilato para llevarse el Cuerpo de Nuestro Señor. Este fue un acto audaz y valiente de fe de parte de un hombre que “esperaba el Reino de Dios.” (Marcos 15:43)

José y Nicodemo juntos colocan el Cuerpo de nuestro Señor con reverencia en lienzos de lino preparados con mirra, áloe y especias: “En el lugar donde fue crucificado había un huerto, y en el huerto un sepulcro nuevo en el que aún no habían puesto a nadie. Como era el día de la Preparación de los judíos, y el sepulcro estaba cerca, pusieron allí a Jesús.”

En su comentario al Evangelio de Mateo, el P. Simeon Leiva-Merikakis rinde homenaje a José de Arimatea. Escribe: “¿Y cómo no rendir homenaje a José de Arimatea? Al realizar una obra de misericordia corporal muy humana, al buscar y enterrar el cadáver de su amado Maestro, José se convierte para siempre en un icono viviente del Padre eterno, inclinándose con compasión para acoger en su pecho palpitante el cuerpo destrozado de su amado Hijo, a quien él mismo entregó a los pecadores por amor a la humanidad. ¡Por fin, el Hijo de Dios en la tierra ha caído en manos, no de un pecador, sino de un hombre justo y compasivo! José de Arimatea representa la justicia y el amor del mismo Dios.”¹

Al celebrar el Domingo de Pascua, la Octava de Pascua, el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia y el Tiempo Pascual, recordemos y pidamos la intercesión del gran José de Arimatea, quien preparó la Tumba de Cristo y el Cuerpo de Cristo con tan delicado cuidado y compasión, con tanta fe, valentía y reverencia. ¡La Tumba está vacía! ¡Él ha resucitado!
