Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Sunday's appointed Gospel, Christ is called upon to address the nature of prayer, from its style and form to its frequency; there is also an underlying theme which would question its efficacy, though this is part of the deeper plan against Christ which is starting to develop.

Prayer was a novel concept in the time of Christ. We are used to it. Centuries of faith and God's providential and protective will have made prayer something which is completely normal to the Christian. We should never take this great ability of ours for granted. Communication with the Lord in the simplest of conversations at whatever time is necessary can change the world, whether it is our personal existence or the greater world in itself.

Prayer is easy; we must talk to God without any worldly nervousness or fear. The typical human experiences of necessity, gratitude, and curiosity all propel the mind to fuel the soul for a conversation with the Lord. Our easy and regular prayer can be the greatest of blessings in our lives.

St. Edmund of Abingdon summed up this comprehension clearly: “I would rather say five words devoutly with my heart than five thousand that my soul does not relish with affection and understanding.”

In the formal prayer of the Eucharist we bring our experience with prayer together and worship as one flock, one people of God. Emboldened with the joined worship of the Lord, we move forward; we must move forward with absolute confidence and peace that the Lord will continue to hear us, listen to us, and respond with the grace of the Holy Spirit through his blessing and guidance.

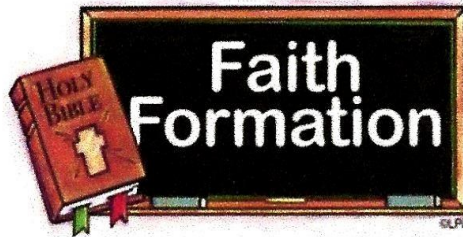
