Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we have a strong reminder of the power of faith in the healing of Bartimaeus, the blind man. Bartimaeus is no fool as he applies to Jesus of Nazareth for his healing. Using the ancient reference of the Old Testament, "Son of David," he speaks to the presence of the real God who is coming to fulfill the covenant of the days of the prophets. The result of his personal hope, rooted in centuries of tradition and expectation is his faith which leads him to call out to Christ in confidence. This hope and this faith is rewarded with his being healed. Following this, "he followed him on the way." This Christian life would have meant great acts of service, or charity, alongside the Messiah himself and as part of a growing collection of believers. Thus we see the three great Christian virtues of faith, hope, and charity working together and informing each other's functions in the life of a single person.

We must all appreciate live and constant cooperation we have with the Holy Spirit through the virtues of faith. Let us be open to his guidance, confident in his power, and always new with enthusiasm for the love of the God upon whom we call with hope.


