Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The entrance into the halfway point of the Advent season is an appropriate time to assess the progress of spiritual understanding of our salvation, achieved through the coming of Christ.

On the preaching of St. John the Baptist which we enjoy today, St. Eusebius of Caesarea remarked that “the voice crying out in the wilderness orders the way to be prepared for. God’s word and the rough ways leveled so that our God may advance when he comes. To ‘prepare the way’ reverse to the preaching of the Gospel by which salvation is made known to all.” (Commentary on Isaiah, chp.40.)

The responsibility and privilege of every Christian includes the measured and discerned preaching of the Gospel based on our station in life. Advent accustoms the soul to the concept of continuous growth in holiness; it also reminds us of how the acceptance of this concept allows for the habit of holiness to take hold. In a sense, Advent is the time for us to understand why we are so joyful at Christmas. In another sense, we are exercising our minds to earn the understanding of the greatness of Christmas. Above all, our prayer should prepare us for the enrichment of celebrating God becoming man for our salvation.

Let us use our time wisely so that our increase in holiness may be of benefit to one and all.

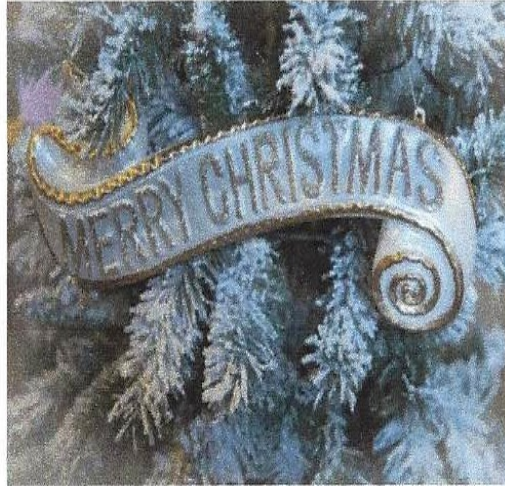
Classes Sunday, December 10th for the children in the **B** class.
