Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On September 14th the universal Church celebrated the ancient Feast of the Exaltation (and discovery) of the Holy Cross of Christ. The exaltation of this great earthly bridge of proof toward supernatural life and eternal salvation also a splendid opportunity for the Church as we consider our own understanding of our connection to Christ.

The veneration of the Holy Cross, personally and as standard Church practice centers around our personal connection to Christ. The brilliant Doctor of the Church from the 1100's, St. Anselm of Canterbury wrote in prayer for his monks:

"Oh Holy Cross of Christ... We do not acknowledge you because of the cruelty that godless and foolish ones prepared you to effect upon the most gentle Lord, but because of the wisdom and goodness of him who of his own free will took you up. For they could not have done anything else his wisdom had permitted it, and he could not suffer except that in his mercy he willed it.

They chose you that they might carry out their evil deeds;
he chose you that he might fulfill the work of his goodness."

The salvation of mankind through the sacrifice of Christ and our celebration of his Passion is a major part of devotional prayer as we enjoy the month of the Holy Cross, the nice and peaceful month of September. Let us always rely on the aid of the Savior in prayer this month, and with great confidence.

Major Responsibilities

- Assist the pastor with clerical and administrative needs as directed
- Administer parish cemetery inquiries including coordinating with funeral homes, sale of grave plots, and ensuring the maintenance of the cemetery grounds
- Answer the parish phone, greet parishioners and attend to their needs
- Maintain parish database and sacrament registers
- Provide administrative support for the pastor including all correspondence
- Maintain all sacramental records at the parish
- Maintain parish master calendar, census data, Mass cards
- Coordinate key parish ministries, such as baptisms, weddings and funerals
- Oversees weekly collections
- Provide support for parish events
- Prepare weekly bulletin

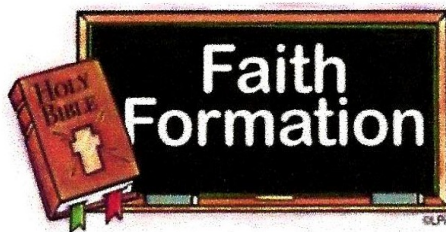

Welcome back to class!

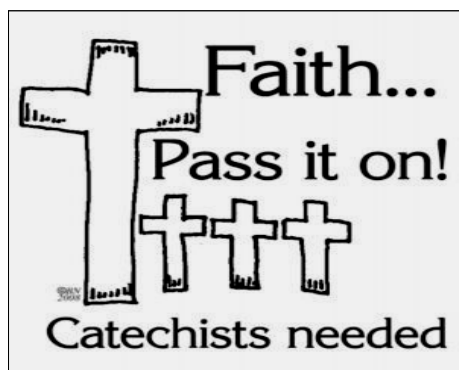
