Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel provides us with a lengthy discourse by Christ. This is not the typical parable style which Christ employed quite often in his mission, rather it is an instruction created around an engagement with the people and the use of the famous 'Socratic dialogue,' which is to keep asking questions to distill a conclusion which hopefully will provide wisdom.

Trust is at the heart of his lesson and is very much the crown of the discourse since it features so strongly in the conclusion of his interchange with the crowd.

We understand trust, as a human virtue, “to be a firm belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone or something.” (OED v.c1225.) Our individual faith informs the trust we have in the universal faith we all share but also empowers the deeds of goodness and charity which allow for others to benefit from our actions. Our lives of faith have the ability to earn a trust which is exceptional and exemplary to others; informed by the Eucharist and Christ's example, we provide a trustworthy example of Christian belief.

St. Paul of the Cross preached (with intense hyperbole,) “Entrust yourself entirely to God. He is a most loving Father who would rather let heaven and earth collapse than abandon anyone who trusted in Him.” (Letters, v.3. 5). Let us then enjoy our trust in God and strengthen it before his altar so that we may project it to others. In this way, we strive for the heavenly reward while we invite others in good conduct and admirable faith; let us be trustworthy Christians.

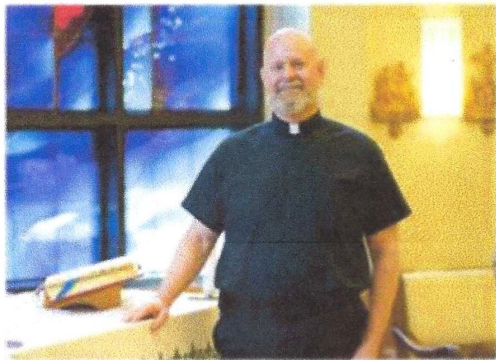

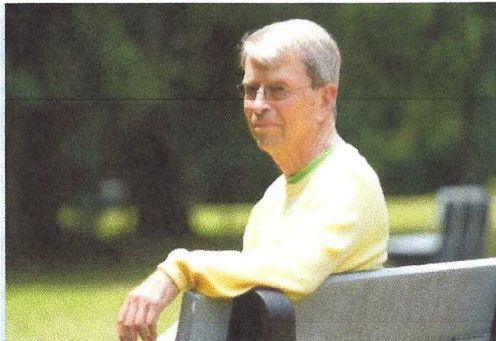
