Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Meditating on the Gospel for this Sunday, we can take wisdom from the ancient Roman adage, “*Nihil utilius est sole et sale.*” That is to say, “Nothing is more useful than sun and salt.” In our happy home by the sea, this is not new information.

The significance of light is obvious when we consider Christ’s mention of it though the reference to salt is more detailed than one would first consider. Not dissimilar from today, in Christ’s time (and before) salt had a currency-like valuation due to its ability to preserve food in a variety of manners and treat wounds, on top of seasoning cuisine.

Christ calls us to have the daily and constant power of light and salt to the degree that we would be likened to a successful city, built on the proper use of daily and earthly elements that sustain others in peace and prosperity. This is no easy task but it is one we can understand and one to which we can apply ourselves, with the help of God’s grace.

Let us enjoy the Eucharist this Sunday so as to be inspired to God’s constant call and be at peace with his constant aid as we go forward living our faith in word, deed, thought, and prayer.
