Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As the Church returns to the season of Ordinary Time and begins to enter a new year in earnest, it is best that we turn toward the lesson presented in the Gospel of this Sunday; when St. John the Baptist pointed to Christ, it was an underscoring of the presence of Christ which we are all called to enjoy. With the end of the Christmas season, we have celebrated God being born as man. Now, our calling is to follow the instruction of St. John for our lives and turn to Christ, recognizing his closeness and responding as the holy psalm encourages us to pray: Here I am Lord, I come to do your will.

As we approach the Lord, let us contemplate his identity in the peacefulness of prayer and the quietude of our hearts in pleasant moments so that we may enjoy God's closeness. This can be a great spiritual work, one which is crafted over time. St. Thomas Aquinas once preached, "We can't full knowledge all at once. We must start by believing; then afterwards we may be led on to teas the evidence for ourselves." *Summa Theologica* (ST I-II, Q. 2, Art. 3.)

This week, let us go for with the joy an energy of celebrating a God truly with us and a future under the care of the saints and angels who intercede and protect us. In that manner, we may discern the ways of peace which the Lord has prepared for us.

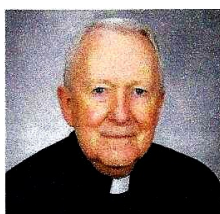

Tour of the Crypt Chapels & Benediction

The crypt under the Seminary’s Main Chapel is a hidden treasure trove of artistic distinction. It houses twelve small chapels, each a gem of exquisite beauty. Sunlight filters into this area through glass roundels of deep red, blue and violet. Each chapel is enclosed behind wrought iron grill work; each altar is of marble, designed to fit the saint to whom the particular chapel is dedicated. Join Msgr. Charles R. Fink as he explores the history of these chapels and offers a detailed description of each. The program will conclude with Benediction, followed by light refreshments in the Refectory.
